Hanna passed through the Baltimore area with mostly rain and moderate winds, but the anticipated coastal flooding did not materialize.

Since shelters were not needed, RACES operators were sent a "stand down message".

## W3PGA GETS QSL From Ship to Shore Station KPH

Every July 12th the Maritime Radio Museum sponsors an on the air special event called "Night of Nights". The idea is to bring CW operation back to the Maritime bands if only for one night.


The shore stations call CQ, send bulletins and even handle traffic from and to the ships at sea on the commercial circuits.

Amateur Radio operators and

shortwave listeners are also invited to participate by sending SWL reports to the stations they hear. There is even an amateur radio station, K6PHS that amateurs can contact.
