The European Conference of Postal and Telecommunications Administrations Nixes Generals and Techs

The European Conference of Postal and Telecommunications Administrations, the governing body for ham radio operation in the European Union has disqualified U.S. Technician and General licensees for eligibility to operate in Europe under the CEPT reciprocal operating agreements. Only the U.S. Extra or Advanced Class

Amateur Radio license holders are now permitted to operate under the agreement.

This step is the result of a review of the equivalence of U.S. Amateur Radio Licenses to European counterparts.

Recent changes in U.S. license exam requirements are a reason for this action.
