The Aero Amateur Radio Club had a great year. The membership continued to increase we went from **46** members in 2019 to **49** at the close of 2020. The members were engaged in many operating activities and public service events.

### **COVID-19 Pandemic**

*Events were running as normal until the week of March 8<sup>th</sup>, then all daily routines and social interactions came to a halt. The cause of the multi-month dysfunction was caused by a virus called Covid-19. We found ourself caught up in a deadly world-wide pandemic. Shelter in place became the norm, with outings restricted to Food stores, Pharmacies, Doctors, and a selected group of other retailers. Government offices shut down and we all waited for the pandemic tide to subside. Facial coverings and a 6 foot personnel buffer became the norm. On May 29<sup>th</sup> after 5 pm, restaurants could serve food to outside tables, with social distances and face mask. ## **Aero Club Radio Nets - CW, Phone, and the Baltimore Traffic Net**



Business at the Aero Club monthly Nets was brisk! A second net joined the series. It was Pat's CW net held on Sundays at 20:00 on 146.55 simplex. She also runs the CW nets on other days as needed. Stats for the CW net: **85** sessions as of December 27. A big thanks to Coz WA3RQD and Dave AC3EO for their help as net control in my absence and there were 10 stations that checked in throughout the year. Kudo's to Ken KB3JVP, Jim KC3FBL, Frank KC3FBM and Dave AC3EO for their dedication to the net and practicing their CW skills.

As Pat stated, I am grateful for the interest and dedication these folks have shown for Mr. Morse and his code. I am also proud to report that all of those I have had the pleasure of working with during the past year and a quarter are becoming true "Brass Pounders". Several of them are already making CW QSOs. I am sure that the rest will be on the air using code within the next few months. Rob Ballou is currently using his Morse Code skills working as a representative going from the Baltimore Traffic Net (BTN) to the Maryland, Delaware, and District of Columbia (MDD), a CW traffic net.

I hope you will consider checking into one of our "CW Training Nets". We meet on the air every Sunday at 8PM on 146.55 and at 7:00 pm at the SkyPark, before the regular meetings. Hope you will consider joining our "fine fisted folks" one evening during our CW training nets.

The Club Phone net changes made in 2019 for the club's Phone Nets, seem to work well, the normal 2<sup>nd</sup> Wednesday 440 net, 4<sup>th</sup> Wednesday 2-meter net and the 5<sup>th</sup> Wednesday 10-meter nets.

As for the Phone nets, there were **27** nets held during 2020. The breakdown for the nets was:

70 cm: **10 nets, 6 hrs 3 mins with 67 check-ins**

2-meters: **13 nets, 8 hrs 53 mins with 135 check-ins**

10 meters: **4 nets, 2 hr 24 mins 32 check-ins**

There were no snow nets in 2020. A total of **500** people checked in to nets or ZOOM for a combined time of **31 hrs and 46 mins.**



Also, several of our club members participate in the **Baltimore Traffic Net**, the local part of the National Traffic System (NTS) a voice net held every day at 6:30pm on the Shawsville Repeater 145.330r. This net acts as a starting point to move formal traffic in the form of an ARRL Radiogram (Think the old-style Western Union Telegram) within the State and across the U.S. and Foreign countries.

### **ARRL Phone International DX Contest - March 6-8, 2020**

Club members were invited to the annual "ARRL Phone International DX Contest." The contest started Friday night, March 6, at 20:00 local and ran to Sunday 19:59 local. Our plan was to setup Saturday afternoon and run to about 16:00 on Sunday.

It came together thanks to Ron W3JEH, who provided the information about the contest run by ARRL. The operating place was easy, all it took was an email to the Dean and Mandy of the Skypark Association. I brought my trusty Off Center Fed Dipole (OCD) that works 80-10. Dave AC3EO's brought his rig a YAESU FT DX101MP, it a radio with dual SDR's, a 3-Dimensional Spectrum Stream that can view up to the last 25 seconds of band conditions in real time. It has filters for its filters. Oh, it's a 200-watt rig that happens to have a Touch Screen.



A set up crew consisting of Dave AC3EO, Molly KC3OUU, Tod and Liza, Ray N3RES, and Joe WB3FM was onsite at the Fixed Base Operation (FBO) building at noon on the 7th.



We had two antennas to use, a G5RV and an Off Center fed Dipole (OCD). While erecting the antenna we encountered problems with the weather. Clear skies, mild temps, but the wind speed in the teens made it difficult to put one let alone two. Based on the performance characteristics of the OCF made it the antenna of choice. The antennas were setup and we were operational by 13:30 EST on Saturday.

Using one of the club's towers the OCD Antenna was set up at the side of the Fix Base Operator (FBO) building, my OCD, an MFJ fiber glass pole was used at the center. The end connection was held up with 2 10-foot sections connected to a fence pole. One 100 foot of RG 8 was run and connected to the FTDX101MP. The rig was turned on and no, I mean NO Static at all. The digital noise filters and roofing filters did their job superbly.

We got on the air about 13:30 EST, Dave AC3EO made the first contact, a station in Germany, at 13:38 EST and we were on our way.

Dinner consisted of a couple of Pizza John's Pepperoni Pizzas. Throughout the evening a series of operators came and went, but somehow managed to stay for the pizza, No Problem!



The crew consisting of Larry KB3QWC, Ray N3RES, Dave AC3EO Tod and Lisa, Molly KC3OUU, Bob WA3SWA, Pat AC3F, Tom WA3QLY, Don K3DON his driver friend Gordon, Jerry N3VBJ, Jim KC3FBL his XYL Donna and myself WB3FMT.

The rig was continuously manned from then to about 03:00 EDT and was at 75 contacts when Jerry



left the building. I got back on the radio about 07:30 EDT and the rig was manned till we shut down at 16:45 EDT. Dave AC3EO also made the 100th contact at 11:57 EDT to a station from Lithuania. We all had a lot of fun and are looking forward to doing another contest in the Fall. Come on, as for any club activity any and of the members are welcome to attend to watch, snack out and participate if you want.

## **VEC Testing**



The VE Testing Program was successful as much as we could be! For the 2020-year Pat AC3F and her VE's tested worked at 4 test sessions, 2 at the White Marsh public library and 2 at the Community Hanger building at the Essex Skypark on Field Day Saturday and 1 at a new location the American Legion in Rosedale. Joh Royer N7JKR and the AL staff volunteered the Hall for our use. This is great because libraries are using their conference rooms (our testing locations) to stage returned books as a quarantine measure. The Test session on November 14<sup>th</sup> held at the AL Post had 15 applicants show up and 13 passed.

All told we tested **39 applicants**, **36** were successful. The breakdown was **25** Techs, **8** Generals **3** Extras. The number of VE's participating in 2020 was 13.

## **Public Service Support and Club Contest**

The Aero ARC was not able to participate in the customary civic events as we normally do. At least 5 events this year, all of which were open to the public at various locations on the Eastern Shore, Baltimore County, and the Essex Skypark were canceled or became a virtual event because of COVID-19.

On the Public Service front, Aero member, Bob WA3SWA continued to assist BRATS for various **Multiple Sclerosis Bike Tours** and Walks and participated in other area clubs' activities. This event was canceled.

**The American Diabetes Association's Tour de Cure 20** also canceled due to Covid-19.

**Chesapeake Scouts Aviation Event** was planned for May 15-17, 2020, rescheduled for November 7, then was also canceled.

**Essex Skypark's** annual pancake breakfast open to the public usually held in May was canceled due to COVID-19.

**Essex Skypark's** Wings and Wheels, a Fly-In and Custom and Antique Cars and Truck display open to the public , held in mid-September, was canceled due to COVID-19.

**ARRL Phone Sweepstakes** scheduled for Nov 21 – Canceled. This contest was planned for November 21 -22 but a spike in the daily infection rate, caused cancellation of this event out of caution.

First of all, we had to contend with COVID-19 and all the medical stuff with it. Second, there was a new tenant at the Skypark, who took over the room next to the STEM Flight Simulators. That room was a former storage room the stuff had to go somewhere. We had to contend with the rearranging of furniture and the excessing of not needed artifacts. This meant that the customary VEC testing had to find a new home for the day. It was decided to hold the test in multiple pavilions to meet health requirements and social spacing.



Secondly the Community Hanger had not one but two planes in various stages of being rebuilt. This cut our operational space in half.

So to get started it was agreed to have a modified Field Day Operation. So, we downsized from a 5A station configuration to a 3A configuration – 3 HF stations, 1 CW / Digital and 2 HF stations for voice a 20-meter station and a 10 thru 80 meter station.

We put good use to two Off Center Fed Dipoles and a G5RV. We did not use the multi-band vertical nor the 20-meter beam. Maybe a bad choice?

The Aero ARC's modified Field Day setup did have good results. We worked 36 states (No DE), Canada, Rico, and tow DX contacts Slovak Republic and Vatican City. We made 219 contacts, using Phone, and CW, no digital.

## ***Repeater Upgrade***

On November 10<sup>th</sup> of 2020, the Aero ARC replaced the old 147.24 MHz repeater system. The original system utilized a split site configuration, that is, a transmitter on top of the elevator penthouse and the receiving antenna about 600 feet away on a tower at the gym. This configuration worked well but had a few drawbacks. It did not have a 3-minute timer, the timer was 1 1/2 minutes and was unable to use CTCSS tones on both input and output and it was a vintage (old) transmitter and receiver configuration. Last year when Baltimore County added air conditioners to the school, the repeater was down for a few months because of a damaged control cable running from the penthouse to the roof of the gym.

It was then decided to investigate getting a replacement for the 2-meter system and a new duplexer. Several years ago, the club replaced the 449.575 MHz repeater with a state-of-the-art FM and C4FM

digital unit by Yaesu. This was the DX-1 dual band and dual mode repeater; it could operate on 2-meters or 70 centimeters (one or the other) and receive and transmit in Analog FM or Digital FM in its automatic mode. Whichever mode it receives, it will transmit the same mode out. This was the same model repeater as the 70-centimeter repeater.

With a minimum of problems, the task was done in about 4 hours. The existing 440 repeater was left intact with only the transmitting antenna removed. It is now a single site repeater and it is running 20 watts output. Additional work is planned to add an additional cable to isolate the amplifier, and de-install the old 2-meter and 70-centimeter repeaters. Thanks to club members Jerry N3VBJ, Ken NE3A, Richard KB3VAE, Marty KC3AID, and Joe WB3FMT.

### ***Club's Equipment Trailer***

Thanks to Marty KC3AID, Richard KB3VAE, and Joe WB3FMT, the trailer has a new set of tires installed by Marty and the stabilizer front and rear jacks. This was a two-day effort by Marty, a couple of hours each day on Dec. 22nd and 23<sup>rd</sup>. Thanks for a needed job well done! Looks like the trailer is good for another 20 years.
