

## Special Event: North Point On The Air N3P



It was a Star Spangled Weekend. Tall ships were docked at the inner harbor. Folks in period costume stood guard at Patterson Park and Ft. McHenry. The grounds shook while in the sky above Blue Angels performed amazing aerobatics. Dignitaries including a President and Vice President made appearances and public television broadcast a fireworks capped concert to a national audience.

Meanwhile a few miles east of the city, away from the hoopla, members of the Aero Amateur Radio Club took to the airwaves with Special Event Station N3P to commemorate the little known contribution of the Maryland Militia at North Point during those star spangled days 200 years ago.

N3P began operation at 00:00 UTC on Friday September 13 and concluded at 23:59 UTC on Sunday September 15 on the 40, 20, 15 and 10 meter bands. Operating modes included phone, CW, and PSK31. A total of 165 contacts were made by the Aero team. Before it ended emails requesting a certificate began to arrive.

While 165 QSO's are a small number for a 48 hour operation, one must be mindful that due to the small size of the team N3P could not be on the air continuously.

# From the Skies over Mt. Essex

## SKY Events for October 2014

Oct. 1st- First Quarter Moon.

Oct. 4<sup>th</sup>- USSR's Sputnik 1 launched 1957

Oct. 7<sup>th</sup> – Uranus at Opposition: USSR's Luna 3 photographed the far side of the Moon in 1959.

Oct. 8<sup>th</sup> - *Full Moon* . “Harvest Moon” for the Celtic and the “Hunter’s Moon” Traditional Full Moon Names, also the Hunter Moon. **Total Lunar Eclipse** and Uranus is 1.2° S of Moon.

Oct. 15<sup>th</sup> - Last Quarter

Oct. 20<sup>th</sup> – *The Zodiacal light is visible in N. Lat in the East before morning twilight, for the next two weeks.*

Oct. 21<sup>st</sup> – Orionid Meteor shower (Halley’s comet) approximately 20 per hour. Look East after midnight.

Oct 22<sup>nd</sup> - 1st recorded solar eclipse in China 2136 B.C.

Oct. 23<sup>th</sup> - New Moon. Partial Solar eclipse

Oct. 25<sup>th</sup> – Saturn 1.0° South of the Moon

Oct. 30<sup>th</sup> - First Quarter Moon (Second one in the month)

## **Planet Lookout at mid-Month**

**Sunrise 07:16 EDT and Sunset 18:25 EDT**

**Mercury** in the Morning Sky very low in the East visible last half of the month magnitude +4.5; 10.1 arc seconds.

**Venus** – Low in the East at dawn, rises about 07:02 EDT magnitude -3.9 and 9.8 arc seconds.

**Mars**- Western sky at dusk, sets about 21:29 EDT, magnitude +0.9 and 5.8 arc seconds wide.

**Jupiter**- In the East at Dawn, magnitude -2.0 size 34.8 arc seconds, rises 01:57 EDT.

**Saturn**- Low in Western Sky sets about 19:56 EDT, magnitude +0.6 size 15.4 arc seconds.

**Uranus**- Opposition “Up all night” Rises about 18:02 EDT, magnitude +5.9, size 3.4 arc seconds.

**Neptune** Rises about 16:29 EDT, magnitude +7.9, size 2.4 arc seconds.

## **October Skies - Moon and Sun**

North American observers will be witness to two eclipses during October '14. On Oct 8<sup>th</sup> a Total Lunar eclipse and Oct. 23<sup>rd</sup> a Partial Solar eclipses. For the Lunar eclipse, the main partial phase begins when the Moon enters Earth's umbral shadow at 5:14 a.m. EDT. Totality gets underway at 6:25 a.m. EDT and lasts until 7:24 a.m.

For viewers on the East Coast the Sun rises at 0&:09 EDT and Moonset is 07:14 EDT. If use binoculars and look about 2 moon diameters south of the moon you will spot the planet Uranus. The next Lunar eclipses occur on 4/4/2015 and 9/28/2015.

The second eclipse event occurs on Oct. 23<sup>rd</sup>. Thos a partial eclipse with a maximum percentage of 80% at Arctic Circle and 60% as viewed from the Northern US and Canada. If you live along a line that runs south from central Ontario through Michigan, Indiana, West Virginia, Kentucky, Tennessee, Alabama, and the Florida panhandle, maximum eclipse occurs at sunset and ranges from 30% in Florida up to over 60% at the US Canadian border.

Observers on the East Coast will see the setting Sun at about 24% eclipsed. But, the sun will be very low to the horizon. For Baltimore, MD, the partial eclipse starts at 17:51 EDT with Sunset occurring at 18:13EDT. At the start of the eclipse the Sun will only be 4° above horizon.

The next total solar eclipse will occur on August 21, 2017 and will run the width of the US from Oregon thru South Carolina, This will be a mid-day eclipse and will be about 83% total from the Baltimore - DC area. This eclipse will mimic the one on July 20, 1963 which was 82% as seen in Baltimore.
