Field Day Results for 2016

Last summer's Field Day event was a huge success by any accounts. There were **2,720** entries from the US, Canada and foreign countries. A total of **35,369** people participated in the event these folks made **1,299,207** contacts. And there were also 461 GOTA stations.

CW 578,545

Phone 668,241

Digital 52,421

Class A stations, using Emergency Power clocked in at 1,126 stations or clubs. The Aero club was a 5A class using 5 transmitters and running less than 150 watts.

In our class 5A there were 80 stations nationwide and 5 stations in the MDC area.

Of the 80 stations as a Class 5A we were number 35 with 634 contacts and 3,210 points. AERO was in the top 43.75%

The top score in 5A Class was W2LU with 3,025 contacts and 10,984 points.

In the MDC Section had 49 entries for all classes, we were 2 out of the 5 for our 5A class. AERO was in the top 40%

The top score in the MDC Section was W3M with 1,263 contacts and 4,856 points.

When a station responds the company line is simple.

Thank for you contact W3PGA, Special Event station commemorating the life of those men and women lost on that dreadful day December 7th 1941. Please go to W3PGA.ORG or look us up on QRZ.com for QSL information.

QSL Information

We are not sending out cards by mail nor are we requesting cards by mail. Please refer everyone to QRZ.com or the club website W3PGA.org.

Please add a blurb to the website and QRZ page to submit all QSL requests to my email address KE3HAY@gmail.com. There may be up to a 2 week turn around for an email certificate as I will be doing them in the evenings on Monday, Tuesday and Saturdays.

In the email to me I need:

1. Call sign of station
2. Time and date of contact
3. Band/Frequency
4. GOOD email address for certificate

We will send certificates for SWL stations and ALL DX stations.

Background

Some stations may not know what happened at Pearl Harbor so try to familiarize yourself with a few important details.

1. Just before 8 am 200 Japanese fighters bomb our American naval base.
2. They attacked us for about 2 hours.
3. We lost 2000 American sailors that day.
4. Franklin D. Roosevelt was president at the time Congress declared WAR.

Frequency List

We should try to stay in the “popular” portion of the 75 – 40 – 20 meter bands. The general portion will yield more results typically. 2M contacts simplex are ok but usually not worth the effort. NO REPEATER CONTACTS will be honored.

Good frequencies on **20M** are **14.280, 14.295, and 14.305 (Coast to Coast during the Day)**

Good frequencies on **40M** are **7.178, 7.210, 7.220 (Early AM will be local and afternoon from Mississippi River East, Maine to Florida)**

Good frequencies on **75M** are **3.902-3.950 (Local States MD DE NJ WV PA VA all Day until after 2:00Z)**

Logs

Please log using standard ADIF logs. It will make life easy if they are standard. N3FJP log is a good program. If you need a Program I have a free one that is freeware. Email all logs to Jerry N3VBJ. He will put them together and forward a final log to me for QSL verifications.

Feel free to email me if you have any issues what so ever. During the special event I will answer emails in about 5 minutes and I will be operating most of the day and through the evening.

Ten (10) points per ATV contact

Any contact via remote operation 100 points per contact.
Any contact above the 70 cm band 250 points per contact.
Any satellites including the ISS contacts 500 points per contact.

Any EME (earth-moon-earth) contact 1000 points per contact per team member

Other Info: The same station may be worked any number of times.

Dec 11th – Mercury greatest elongation E 21°

Dec 13th - Full Moon “Cold Moon” for the Traditional American and the “Bitter Moon” for the Chinese Full Moons.

Dec 13th - Aldebaran is 0.5° S of the Moon & Geminids meteor shower, Full Moon, ≈120 per hr, prospects poor viewing.

Dec 14th – Tycho Brahe born in 1546.

Dec 18th – Regulus is 1.0° N of the Moon

Dec 20th - - Last Quarter Moon

Dec 21st - Winter Solstices 05:44 EST (10:44 UT) shortest day 9hrs 20 mins at 40° N.

Dec 21st - USA's Apollo 8, first manned craft to leave earth's gravity in 1968.

Dec 22nd – Ursids meteor shower peak, LQ Moon, ≈ 10 per hr, visible prospect poor.

Can you see me now! – The Pleiades M45

Known pre-historically. Mentioned by Homer about 750 B.C. Modern observing methods have revealed that at least about 500 mostly faint stars belong to the Pleiades an open star cluster located in Taurus the Bull, spread over a 2 degree (four times the diameter of the Moon) field.

The Pleiades also carry the name "Seven Sisters"; according to Greek mythology, seven daughters and their parents. Their Japanese name is "Subaru", which was taken to christen the car of same name.

On March 4, 1769, Charles Messier included the Pleiades as No. 45 (M45) in his first list of nebulae and star clusters, published 1771. The M45 star cluster is estimated to be 443 light-years away based on a 2014 finding.

How good is your eyesight? Traditionally, the average eye can see six stars in the Pleiades the exceptional eye seven.
