The Dragon Ate the Sun!

The Dragon ate the Sun, don't believe me, just ask the Chinese. In ancient China, the solar and lunar eclipses were regarded as heavenly signs that foretell the future of the Emperor and so predicting eclipses was of high importance for the state. Over four millennia ago, legend has it that two astrologers, Hsi and Ho, were executed for failing to predict a solar eclipse.

The reason was that whoever was on the throne would take the wrath of the Dragon. So, when the Astronomers told the emperor of an impending solar eclipse, the emperor would leave town and place a minor official in his place. So this is the story of two astronomers parting it up the day before the eclipse and slept late the day of the eclipse, you can rest assured the replacements astronomers didn't make the same mistake.

We are having a total eclipse of the Sun crossing the U.S. from the Texas, to Maine. The eclipse is caused by the Moon crossing the path of the Sun and blocking it out of view. The path of totality is about 70 miles wide, the path of the Partial eclipse is several 100 miles wide. On April 8th, 2024, the Moon will cover 88% of the Sun surface as seen from Baltimore. Even with 88% of the Sun's surface covered it is still too bright to look at.

To safely view the Sun, you can use an #14 Arc Welding Glass, the same used in a welding helmet, a cardboard box with a pin hold used as a projection, use with your back to the pinhole, you should be able to see an image of the sun.
